Our blind bowling group meets at Hillsborough Park in the summer and Concorde Sports Centre in the winter.

Graham Draycott who runs the group has sent in this write up which was done a couple of months ago.

"As the summer session of the crown green bowling closes for 2019 we look forward to a winter's session at Concord Sport Centre until the new outdoor season begins in April 2020. The year saw us missing one or two sessions due to the wet conditions but thanks to Hillsborough Bowling Club we are able to have a dry place to have a chat and a place to have some refreshments.

Indoors at Concord we are also able to make a social as well as a sporting hour, after which we are brought back to the city centre for 1 o'clock or stay on the bus back to Mappin Street for lunch."

This group is a very friendly group, always looking for new members to join them, just £1.50 whenever you attend and this includes tea & biscuits. Previous experience of crown green bowling is not necessary as many of the group had never played until they joined this group.

Whilst this group meets in Sheffield, people from Rotherham, or indeed anywhere else, are very welcome to join us at any time. The course has been offered for the last four years and comments from past attendees have highlighted a growth in confidence, friendships formed during the course and increased knowledge about how to access support as well as what is available.

Here are some comments from previous clients after completing the course.

- "We have been given the tools on the Looking Ahead course and now it's up to us to use them" (Vicky)
- "It has boosted my energy levels to deal with everyday problems knowing I am not the only person and mum having to cope with this" (Alex)
- "It's been such a relief just talking to people without having to explain about my sight loss every time" (Vicky)
- "I can translate the information back to people who are helping me adapt to life with sight loss" (Bob)
- "I have got my disabled travel pass in the process of being sorted out thanks to this course" (Mary)

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT COFFEE MORNINGS

Our Emotional Support Officer, Hayley, has been working with several of our clients who need emotional support at different stages, for example when adjusting to sudden sight loss, or adapting to a worsening condition.

Peer support is often really beneficial and we would like to invite clients who have benefited from the Emotional Support service, or anyone who would just like to find out more about the service.

ACTIVITIES CENTRE

SEEING WELLBEING

The range of activities to help improve wellbeing continue. Some of them are included as part of our Thursday Activities but in addition we have:

Mindfulness

We recently ran an 8 week Mindfulness course; we had excellent feedback from the clients that attended and they all found it really beneficial so we are hoping to arrange another course early next year.

We have run sports/gym taster sessions with Disability Awareness with Sport (DAWS). These are fun sessions doing a range of activities in a safe, accessible environment. Details are still being finalised, including dates, times and costs.

After positive feedback from all who attended the preliminary sessions we now have a regular monthly session taking place on the first Wednesday of every month (except January when it is on 8th January) at Hillsborough Park. The cost is £5 per person per session.

We meet at **SRSB** for the Sheffield clients and **RSS** for Rotherham clients and travel to Hillsborough on the tram/tram train.

OTHER NEWS HIDDEN DISABILITY SUNFLOWER LANYARDS

The sunflower design is now recognised by a number of organisations across the UK and was initially adopted by Gatwick Airport as a way of alerting staff to people with a hidden disability who might require additional assistance. Companies such as Sainsbury's, Argos and Marks & Spencer now have the lanyards available and some of our clients are using them. A number of other airports and other retailers are implementing the scheme as well.

A new app for smart phones and tablets is now available for both Apple and Android devices which allows you to listen to over 200 local and regional talking newspapers from around the UK, including Sheffield Talking News. Why not give it a try – the app is just called "Talking News" if you search for it in the Apple store or Play store.
