

CORONAVIRUS – THE IMPACT

What a strange year 2020 has been. We started off well in January but by the end of February Coronavirus was starting to take hold and by 23rd March we were in full lockdown. This resulted in enormous changes for us as a charity with all our fundraising events cancelled, many of our services suspended, staff on furlough leave and no visitors for the residents at Cairn Home.

I don't think anybody expected the situation to carry on as long as it has. With no end in sight towards the end of July we regrettably had to take some tough decisions and commence restructuring our services to enable us to ensure the future viability of our charity. This unfortunately resulted in 16 staff being made redundant but we are now very well placed to move forward and continue the development of our services for the future. I would like to

thank all the staff unfortunately made redundant for their commitment to our clients and the charity over many years.

Having spent the last 20 years developing the services and building up the charity I personally, like many other staff, found this a very difficult time, made even more challenging by being the first time in the charity's history to be forced to make staff redundant.

As I write this we hear the news of a possible vaccine which could be being rolled out very soon – I certainly hope so and that Christmas 2021 will be back to some semblance of normality.

Here's hoping that 2021 will be a vast improvement over 2020, I doubt it could be any worse!

CHRISTMAS ACTIVITIES

Do you spend Christmas alone?

Christmas can be a very lonely time for many people, families may live away, and friends are often too busy, lunch clubs and day centres close over the festive period. This can often lead to people feeling quite isolated and down at a time when most are making merry and having a good time.

At **SRSB** we have looked at ways to combat this and a couple of years ago we came up with the idea of Festive Friends where we provided a meal out at The Old Queen's Head on Christmas Day itself, supported by volunteers and a number of our clients who attended were very complimentary about this.

- Delivery Driver/Property Maintenance covering both our Sheffield and Rotherham Centres was taken by Dennis Crofts, previously one of our minibus drivers.
- Equipment Officer supporting clients and staff across both our Sheffield and Rotherham Centres was taken by Rob McCann who previously ran our Equipment Centre.
- Activities & Groups Co-ordinator for clients across both our

Sheffield and Rotherham Centres was taken by Joy Waters who previously was our Café Assistant.

- Development Officer, responsible for delivering visual impairment awareness training and our Looking Ahead courses, was taken by Liz Bowman who previously was part of our Community Engagement Team.

They have all settled into their new roles and starting to develop additional services.

ZOOM VIDEO AND TELEPHONE CONFERENCING

Many of our services and activities are now being delivered via Zoom. Some people may feel a bit inhibited or nervous about using this new way of working but, based on feedback we have received from clients who we have persuaded to try it, please be assured that it is something that you can do if you have an internet connection and we will guide you through the process.

For people without an internet connection then we have set up telephone conference facilities where we call you and join you into a group session.

LOOKING AHEAD COURSES

At the moment these courses are only available being delivered online via Zoom video conferencing.

The course offers an introduction to help and support for daily living, accessing information in print, magnifiers, mobility, how IT and

mobile phones can help and a range of guest speakers from both within and beyond **SRSB** and **RSS**.

The course has been offered for the last six years and comments from past attendees have highlighted a growth in confidence, friendships formed during the course and increased knowledge about how to access support as well as what is available.

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

Our Emotional Support Officer, Hayley Martin, is working albeit all her consultations are now being done over the phone. She is in great demand at the moment but she does have some capacity to take on more clients. JOB CLUB

COMMUNITY ADVICE SERVICES

Our Community Advice Officers are working partially in the office and partially from home advising clients, carrying out initial assessments, organising delivery of equipment, attending to welfare benefit claims etc. If you require any help, support or advice please do not hesitate to contact us.

HEARING AID SERVICES

We are able to service hearing aids at both Rotherham and Sheffield or if we can't carry out any aspect we can contact the audiology department on your behalf. If you require batteries, tubing or anything else regarding your hearing aids then please get in touch with us.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Joy Waters, our new Activities and Groups Co-ordinator, is organising the following groups:

Cycling

After positive feedback from all who attended the preliminary sessions at Hillsborough Park we had a regular monthly session prior to lockdown in

March this year. In October we restarted the sessions for 4 clients on a weekly basis observing full social distancing but the recent lockdown has suspended these sessions. We are hopeful that they will restart soon and if you would like to be included please just let us know.

These sessions are free of charge.

Telephone Conference Groups

CHILDREN & FAMILY SERVICES – SRSB & RSS

Our dedicated Children and Families Officer was unfortunately made redundant as all the group activities have had to stop due to COVID. However, our Community Advice Officers can still support families with welfare benefits such as completing Disability Living Allowance claims, Family Fund applications etc. Please

CHARLES BONNET SYNDROME (CBS) SUPPORT GROUP

Are you experiencing vivid, silent visual hallucinations?

If so you are not alone, you may be suffering from a condition called Charles Bonnet Syndrome that affects many people of all ages who are having problems with their vision. The onset of these hallucinations are not due to mental health but are caused by loss of sight. They can be very disturbing and can impact negatively on your daily life.

As mentioned earlier in this newsletter we are looking to get this group operating again.
