## SRSB AND RSS NEWS 160TH ANNIVERSARY

Sadly due to COVID 19 regulations we had to postpone all the events we had planned last year to celebrate our 160th Anniversary but we decided that we still had to mark the occasion so we started with our Gala Dinner at Weston Park Museum on Friday 17th September. #### Heritage Lottery Funding

To help us mark the occasion of our 160th Anniversary we have been successful in applying for lottery funding which will enable us to deliver a few projects:

#### A Commemorative Brochure

We have produced a brochure which summarises our history with photographs and text from the last 160 years. This brochure was handed to all our guests at the gala dinner and the lottery funding now enables us to let all of our clients have a copy. ## LOCAL TALKING NEWSPAPERS

Talking Newspapers are a great source of information for people with a visual impairment and we are fortunate to have two really good ones in our area – Sheffield Talking News (STN) and Rotherham Talking Newspaper (RTN).

Both STN and RTN are totally independent charities mainly run by volunteers. We have a particularly close working relationship with STN as they are based at our Mappin Street Centre.

Traditionally, talking newspapers have been delivered first on audio cassette tapes, then CD and now memory sticks but as technology moves on there are many other ways of accessing their recordings including over the telephone, streaming over the internet, and smart speakers such as Alexa and Google.

## TECHNOLOGY & EQUIPMENT SUPPORT

Jake and Rob continue to support people with advice and training on all types of technology and equipment. If you are struggling with anything tech related or are considering purchasing something then please get in touch with Jake. Alternatively, for other equipment to help with your visual impairment please speak to Rob.

#### **Synapptic Tablets and Phones**

We have received funding to loan out tablets and phones running Synapptic software which makes using tablets or smart phones very simple and accessible for people with a visually impairment, including using speech to tell it what you want to do. The phones or 12.4 inch tablets are loaned out on a 3 month "try before you buy" basis so that you can be confident you are going to use the equipment before making the commitment to buy it. You will also benefit from purchasing it at a discounted price. Full training on the tablet is included.

If you wish to register your interest in this please contact us. The take up so far has been very good but we still have some funding left to loan out a few more.

One of the first people to take a phone was Danny who sent us this feedback:

"After many attempts of trying to befriend technology and all its assistive capabilities, I never have yet managed to use a laptop, tablet or a touchscreen mobile phone successfully.

During August this year Steve Hambleton suggested that I try Synapptic, and he explained to me how this was software which was

loaded onto Samsung devices and designed for people with sight loss.

He kindly offered the loan of one of these products for me to try and see if this software was of any help to me. I then visited **SRSB** for a

demonstration from Jake and decided that the phone was the best option for me.

I'll come now straight to the point. It is the only software that can even make a luddite like me sit up and listen. By this I mean that from never in my life being able to read and send emails, I have not only achieved this in less than two weeks but I have found that I can use video calls on WhatsApp quite easily.

The significance of this does not need much explaining, suffice to say, that my mother and sister live abroad. My mother is 92 and not well enough to travel to see me any more. Naturally COVID restrictions have prevented me from travelling and also my physical health has deteriorated to a level where I am unable to travel for some time yet. I have of course spoken to my mother and sister on several occasions by phone, but imagine what it meant not only to me but my mum to be able to speak and see me. The fact that I have no sight is irrelevant at this point.

The Synapptic software has enabled me to make a call which facilitates someone like my elderly mum to be able to see me.

The Synapptic feature is impressive and the support from the staff of Synapptic is equally so. By just making a phone call they are always helpful and able to assist with any problems and questions.

There was one occasion when I rang them and a member of their team called Louis must have spent nearly half an hour on the phone with me and even sorted out my setting etc remotely.

An equal level of support by other members of the team, such as Kieran and Bret, is also always on hand.

The way Synapptic works in brief, is that it has made a device, such as a Samsung smartphone, much easier to operate for someone with no sight and who has no experience of using such technology.

I can only recommend that a very good introduction for someone interested in Synapptic is to listen to the 52 minute demonstration video on Youtube by Adrian of Synapptic. There are other demo videos, but this particular one is the simplest and easiest to follow.

I cannot thank Steve enough for suggesting to me that I try Synapptic and for providing the loan of a Samsung phone with this software installed.

There is much more for me to learn, but in professor Chris Whitty lingo "I'm not yet doing somersaults, but at least I've achieved a handstand".

#### **Online Shopping**

We have recently taken part in some preliminary research with a student from the University of Sheffield around the subject of online shopping for visually impaired people. We like to support these kind of studies where we can so that their gained knowledge will hopefully improve accessibility when they begin their careers.

Early in 2022 Amnah would like to expand her research to talk to groups of clients who are interested in taking part and it is proposed that this will take place on Zoom. Participants will need to be able to share their screen so Amnah can watch and take notes.

#### **Hearing Aid Repairs**

We are able to service hearing aids at both Rotherham and Sheffield or if we can't carry out any aspect we can contact the audiology department on your behalf. If you require batteries, tubing or anything else regarding your hearing aids then please get in touch with us. An appointment for hearing aid repairs is essential at both Rotherham and Sheffield, just give us a call.

#### British Sign Language (BSL)

With more BSL interpreters being seen on TV the interest in sign language has increased. We are currently taking names for a future BSL taster course in the new year, date to be confirmed so please contact Tony at **RSS** if you are interested. In the meantime there are free sign language apps available and we recommend the Signbsl app available on both Google Play store and Apple App store for those that want to try learning a few signs.

#### **Smart TV's and Hearing Loops** The increase in new smart TV's has led to problems with personal

listeners and hearing loops no longer working, this is due to the way the loop is connected to the TV and not a fault of the equipment. This can be sorted by connecting the aid to the TV a different way. Please contact Tony Atkin at **RSS** for any assistance.

#### **Deaf Awareness Course**

## TELE-CONTACT AND TEL-FRIENDS

#### **Tele-Contact**

We have a team of volunteers who contact clients that we haven't had any contact with for a while, just to check that they are OK and to check that we still have the correct information on our database. If you receive such a call please do not be alarmed but if you are unsure then just give us a call at **SRSB** and we will be able to check if a call is scheduled to be made.

#### **Tele-Friends**

We also have a team of volunteers who call the same people every week as a befriender. This is predominantly for people that live alone and don't get out very much. If you would like to receive this type of call please let us know.

## **OTHER ACTIVITIES**

Annette Parker, our Activities and Groups Co-ordinator, has made a great start with us and now has numerous groups running on a regular basis.

For groups meeting in our centre we still have COVID precautions in place which include wearing masks on arrival and having to take a lateral flow test. If you are able to carry out lateral flow tests yourself then we can supply these to you so you can do a test just prior to travelling to our centre and bring the test result with you. If you are not able to do a test yourself then please arrive 30 minutes before the group start time shown here.

All the groups are free except where a cost is stated under each group.

#### **Meditation**

Every Tuesday via Zoom from 8:30am to 9am

These sessions are delivered by Catherine, who used to run yoga sessions at our centre in Sheffield prior to the first lockdown.

#### **Creative Writing Group**

This group has resumed their weekly meeting at our Mappin Street Centre, Fridays, 11am to 1pm. If anybody is unable to attend in person but can use Zoom then we can link you up with the group that way.

#### **Singing Group**

Mondays, 10:30am to 12:30pm

Our singing group has resumed their meetings at our Mappin Street Centre. No experience required, just a desire to enjoy singing with other people. New members very welcome.

#### Cycling

Wednesdays, 12:30pm to 1:30pm, Hillsborough Park

These weekly sessions have now restarted so if you would like to join the group please get in touch with Annette. You will need to make your own way to Hillsborough Park.

The cost is £4 per person per session.

#### **Running with Sighted Guides**

Wednesday, 1:45pm, Hillsborough Park

These sessions follow on from the cycling so come along and see how you get on.

#### Swimming

Thursdays, 10:30am to 11:45am, Zest, Upperthorpe Pool

Our weekly swimming sessions have now resumed but at a slightly earlier time. Minibus transport from our Mappin Street Centre may be available but please check first.

People will require a Zest Card, cost £3 per annum and then each session costs £3.20

#### Yoga

Every Thursday via Zoom, 9am to 10am

These sessions are delivered by Catherine, who used to run the yoga

sessions at our centre in Sheffield prior to the first lockdown.

#### Tai Chi

Fridays, 2:30pm to 3:30pm

This group has now gone back to Zoom until March 2022 when the situation will be reviewed.

Sandra has been working with our visually impaired clients for over 10 years, so you are in experienced hands. She will give step by step instructions to the practice and also set practice exercises for the group.

New starters are welcome to join these sessions, so don't worry if you don't have any experience.

#### **Baking Group**

Tuesdays, fortnightly, 1pm to 3pm

Our baking group has now resumed sessions at our Mappin Street Centre. Come along to bake your favourite cakes or biscuits with the support of a volunteer. The aroma in our centre is always lovely on Tuesday afternoons.

#### **Book Club**

We are re-starting our Book Club where everybody gets the same book from Calibre Audio Library and then meets to discuss it. Meetings will be monthly at our Mappin Street Centre. Please contact Annette Parker or Liz Gurler if you are interested in joining the group.

#### Craft Group

Mondays, 10am to 12noon

Fridays, 10am to 12noon and 1:30pm to 3:30pm

This group has resumed its meetings at our Ship Hill Centre. There's usually lots of laughter as well as making things such as cards and, at the moment, Christmas decorations.

#### **Activity Packs**

Our Activity Packs continue to be popular every week now going out to almost 250 clients. Each pack contains a large print Word Search, Crossword, Quiz Questions, Colouring Page and Sudoko with the solutions sent out the following week. For people that struggle with large print we will endeavour to identify alternative solutions.

The packs are themed to keep things interesting and feedback from you about different subjects is always welcome.

This was at Hallamshire Tennis Club and was very successful.

Sessions will be monthly starting in the new year on 22nd January, 26th February, 26th March and 23rd April.

#### <u>Ten Pin Bowling</u>

This was at Superbowl, Rotherham and was enjoyed by everybody that attended.

Sessions will be monthly at a cost of £7 for 2 games, usually followed by a pub lunch.

#### <u>Snooker</u>

This will be at Stephen Harrison Centre in Sheffield with professional coaching sessions, costs to be decided.

#### Visually Impaired Rifle Shooting

These are at Rotherham & Chantry Rifle Club. We have held two taster sessions already and we have received really good feedback. The shooting is done with a .22 air rifle with audio feedback rather than optical sights. We will be holding more taster sessions and looking at how we can establish a regular group.

We provide minibus transport from both our Mappin Street and Ship Hill Centres to/from the rifle club, cost £5 per session.

We have secured funding for the table with associated equipment and we have a young client who is keen to get involved with running a weekly session. 
