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Introduction

We've been having another busy year so far at **SRSB/RSS** and **Cairn Home** with lots happening and lots of exciting developments.

One of our biggest projects has been the refurbishment at our Centre in Rotherham. The launch of Phase 1 of the refurbishment will improve accessibility and capacity by installing a lift, moving the main entrance and building a ramp, carrying out a full ground floor refurbishment including a new cafe, accessible toilets on the 1st & 2nd floors and carrying out a basic makeover of the rest of the building.

It's going well and we're hoping that it may be completed early Autumn.

We are very much looking forward to being able to expand our groups and activities in Rotherham.

We are beginning work on a new website for **SRSB/RSS** and **Cairn** soon and look forward to sharing more about this.

We continue to expand our range of groups and have a varied choice with something for everyone. One of the areas we are seeing expanding quite a lot is groups for research, feedback and consultations, giving our clients the chance to make a difference to subjects that affect their daily life.

We've also started regular drop in sessions around welfare rights queries, which have been popular.

Our fundraising activities have given us the ability to do so much more for various projects and we are continually grateful to the many individuals, trusts and organisations in our community who generously support our work.

Our volunteering activities are growing again and we have an amazing team who kindly donate their time and experience. Cairn is continuing with the refurbishment of their en-suite bathrooms and they're looking great!

SRSB, RSS Updates

Our Impact:

We thought you might be interested to read a few statistics about our impact in Sheffield and Rotherham:

We currently have over 4,000 clients in Sheffield and over 2,000 clients in Rotherham and this number is growing all the time, and since the beginning of the year we have had 366 new clients.

In the first quarter of the year our Community Advice Officers (CAOs) carried out 326 visits, our Technology Trainer gave support to 45 clients and we issued 308 pieces of equipment. We're regularly running or supporting 23 different activity groups either weekly or fortnightly.

Our charity is there for your sight and/or hearing loss journey, providing day to day support to our clients to help you live your best life. From your initial registration we will be there to support you when you need us, and always in the background when you don't, ready to swing back into action if things change.

Meet the Team:

Jenny: "Hi my name is Jenny and I work at Cairn Home. I started in 1994 working in the kitchen as Kitchen Assistant, then progressed to Head Cook. In 2009 I went on maternity leave to have my son Sam. I returned to work in 2010 as Head Cook. After a while I wanted a new challenge and became Activities Coordinator for a number of years, which I really enjoyed, especially driving the minibus and taking our residents on various outings like Blackpool. On one occasion I had to flag down a passer-by to jump start the minibus due to a flat battery; the residents found this very amusing and wanted to stay in Blackpool!

My role now is Utility Person which means I do a lot of maintenance around the home including maintaining the garden. I still drive the minibus for the residents to go on various outings. I've seen many changes over the years in the décor of the home, and the menus have changed a lot with much more choice. There have also been changes in the residents' care needs, but Cairn has continued to adapt to provide amazing care for them. Last year we started work on the en-suite bathrooms and are continuing the work on these throughout this year. We are also in the process of decorating other areas of the home. Last year I did the zip wire challenge in Wales with my son Sam, and we had a great time raising £475 for Cairn Home. I have nominated myself and Sam to do more challenges this year to raise more funds!"

Steve: "My name's Steve, I'm the Fundraising Manager for **SRSB/RSS** and **Cairn**.

I joined in January 2021 and was two days into the job before another of the lockdowns happened!

I have over 30 years' experience of fundraising in the voluntary sector, including for homelessness, disability sports, overseas aid and healthcare charities.

During my first year, there was very little community fundraising or in-person contact with our clients and supporters due to the pandemic. As things have opened up, it has been fantastic to begin to meet so many inspirational people, and to put on more fundraising events and collections in which people can get involved. I look forward to us all building on this in the future. Thank you."

ECLO's (Eye Clinic Liaison Officers): Our ECLOs are the first point of contact at the hospital and refer new clients to our services, providing information and advice at this critical point of diagnosis. Many of our referrals are via them.

Emotional Wellbeing (SRSB & RSS): Our Emotional Support Officer Hayley and our Counsellor and Psychotherapist Jack update us:

Emotional Support is available for anyone wanting an informal chat to share thoughts and feelings on coping with sight loss. This would take place at the Centre and is not limited to one session. Support and encouragement given to access other services if needed or just use the time and space to talk and share your story. If further long-term support is required, a referral to our

counselling services can be discussed. Please contact us and ask for Hayley Martin, our Emotional Support Officer.

Our Counselling and Psychotherapy service with Jack is a place to talk about sight loss, bereavement or any issues affecting your mental health. 10 free sessions in person, online or over the phone. Please contact Hayley for a referral.

NEW: We'll be running group sessions called 'Feel Good Tuesdays' for anyone wanting to improve their mental and overall health. These will be themed and hopefully include some professional input on the chosen theme. Some of the themes we'll cover are: healthy eating, exercise, alternative therapy, how to improve how you feel.

Any ideas or suggestions you would like to provide please let us know.

The first session will be on Tues 25th July 10am to 12pm with Chris the Aromatherapist & Reflexologist who will be bringing oils in for us to smell and talking about the benefits of massage. If anyone has any skills they can offer who would like to come along and help host a session you would be most welcome. Please get in touch via the Centre with Hayley Martin (Emotional Support Officer) or Jack Silveroak (Counsellor) who will be corunning the sessions.

We also have some free samples that have been kindly donated by Lush Meadowhall for attendees at the session in July.

NEW: Life Ahead service. This service is now up and running and Sarah is our Life Ahead Project Coordinator. This service is available for **SRSB/RSS/Cairn's** clients.

Assess: Your current situation. Adapt: Plan your journey.

Achieve: Realise your goals.

Life Ahead is based around a questionnaire designed to make the link between your identified goals (small or large) and helping you to get there by referring you appropriately to our range of services or those of other organisations.

The questionnaire is designed to help you take stock of your current situation and to identify some realistic outcomes, whether

they are small steps or big ambitions. We will then be able to signpost you to the most relevant services or groups to help you grow your confidence and promote independence.

We will come back to this form at an agreed time with you and review whether you achieved your outcomes or whether your requirements and goals have changed.

Our charity is there for your sight and/or hearing loss journey providing day to day support to our clients to help you live your best life. From your initial registration we will be there to support you when you need us, and always in the background when you don't, ready to swing back into action if things change.

Even if things seem overwhelming at the moment, you will meet lots of people who want to encourage and empower you, that could be our staff, our clients, our volunteers or our supporters. We have seen incredible change, reinvention and growth with so many of our clients and it is our goal to help you adapt to a new life or to changes or challenges that you are experiencing. We've heard so many people say that their life has taken a different turn and by accepting our support they have been able to grow, gain confidence, learn new skills, meet new people and experience things they had never thought of before (such as doing skydives and abseils!). They've found out about support they didn't know was there, equipment and technology to enhance their life, mix with others in a similar situation, made contacts with people who they may not have met previously and also made friends for life (we've even had some romances!!!).

If you would like to find out more about this service you can call Sarah for an informal chat with no commitment. The feedback we have had so far is that people have found it really useful, helped them to think things through and focus their thoughts on their Life Ahead.

Awareness

We work hard to raise awareness of issues and challenges that our clients face, sharing information relevant to them from various organisations and also about the work of our charity. This includes being involved in consultations and focus groups on a variety of issues.

One of the most recent research groups was about hospital inpatient experience with The University of Sheffield and was very productive. There will be more sessions on this subject, so just get in touch if you'd like to be involved.

We also held a session around voting accessibility ahead of the local elections.

The newly established Discussion Group addresses a variety of topics and at their last meeting they discussed street clutter. We were very grateful to BBC Radio Sheffield for visiting us to interview one of our My Sighted Guide volunteers and the client she is supporting. They then invited us to the studio to talk about the Simulation Specs that we use in training, where Toby Foster tried them on and discussed the impact they had on him while live on air.

We are looking forward to welcoming back Radio Sheffield reporter Arzu, who will be visiting our next Charles Bonnet Syndrome Group to help us raise awareness of this condition.

We get involved with students doing a variety of courses and have recently organised interviews with our clients around several subjects, most recently with some students interviewing and filming a client navigating the city.

Carving has started on the Covid Memorial Poem boulder by sculptor Jason Turpin-Thomson. Final planting, including the recess areas, was scheduled for the end of May. Gloria tells us about her experience of the weekly

Tapdancing sessions: I go to the Tap Dancing sessions at City Limits every Monday afternoon with a group on the minibus from **SRSB**'s Mappin St Centre. I really enjoy the exercise and using your brain as there is a lot of work around memory of the steps and coordination. Being part of a group activity is great fun and dancing to the music is great!

I didn't realise that I would be learning to tap dance at 70-something! But I love it and would encourage anyone who is thinking about it to give it a go.

Katie who teaches us is very patient and gives clear descriptions of the steps. Every week I say to her, 'Thanks, I know I'm rubbish, but I've enjoyed it!'

(Editor's note - Gloria isn't rubbish!)

Jordan shares his story

Sport has played a big part in the life of our client Jordan both before and since he lost most of his sight. And now it has the potential to help unlock a whole new career for him – as a sports massage therapist.

Jordan gained his sports therapy qualification after a comprehensive training course. His original plan had been to become a post 16 sports tutor when he qualified as a teacher several years ago. But the deterioration in his sight (his vision became blurry when he was playing football in his student days) meant that ambition had to go on hold. "It just came out of the blue. I went to the optician and then the eye hospital and after

checks I was told I had Leber's Optic Hereditary Neuropathy (LOHN). Within four months I had almost completely lost my left eye. I still had a bit of vision in my right but not much." Jordan was determined though to complete his PGCE teaching qualification and although he did that after studying for another year, he eventually decided it wasn't the route he wanted to take and changed direction to sports massage therapy.

"I like to help people and the work is mostly done by touch so sight isn't as important. It's something I enjoy and I'm not putting as much pressure on myself as I would be standing in front of a classroom," said Jordan. And as a keen sportsman himself, he has a lot of understanding of the issues involved.

He is now seeing clients at two different venues. He is at **SRSB's** Mappin Street Centre offering appointments every Friday to clients and members of the public, and also has a room in the Nuffield Gym on Napier Street off Ecclesall Road.

Jordan credits the opportunities he has had to take part in sport for helping to build his confidence to take a new career path. He's tried VI Tennis, shooting and baseball as well as football.

He is pleased that **SRSB/RSS** has signposted him to new activities for younger people but wishes he had taken part when he first experienced sight loss eight years ago. "It has helped me now, but back then it would have helped me and helped my confidence, it all seemed unattainable at the time. It's very difficult to meet people of my age with VI. In fact, I did think at one time of setting up my own group to help people under 40 to get together and meet people."

He has a lot on his hands building his new work life and balancing that with bringing up his young daughter. However, in 2022 Jordan managed to find time to join a British Blind Sport Knowledge Exchange programme trip to Italy and says "I was fortunate to have the opportunity to go to Italy to play blind baseball as part of a GB developmental team.

The adaptation of the popular game of baseball gives the VI community the opportunity to play a fast and exciting game.

Myself and others involved enjoyed the experience. The quality of the coaching was at a really high standard and we learnt a lot from the trip. I would recommend anyone from our VI or blind community to give it a go."

He hasn't given up on his original ambition to work with young people. He's still planning on doing youth work with visually impaired youngsters in the future.

Jordan is currently involved in establishing a VI multi sports group with our support.

Volunteering

A message from Andrea to our volunteers: "We have a fantastic team of dedicated volunteers who have been with us for many years and we can't thank them enough for all their continued support, time, and effort which benefits our clients enormously. We have a growing team of new volunteers in all areas at **SRSB/RSS** which increases our ability to provide a full, friendly, varied and accessible service.

Our Befriending Coffee Mornings continue to be well attended and our clients increasingly benefit from having a team of well-informed volunteers. We are continuing to grow our Befriending Services, and our Telephone Befriending Service remains a popular point of contact to **SRSB/RSS** services. We do still require volunteers of all ages and backgrounds so please spread the word amongst family and friends to get in touch if they want to find out more about the training and how to get involved. We are also pleased that our My Sighted Guide Service has three new matches ready to begin their agreed goals and we wish them all well."

Feedback from one of our My Sighted Guide volunteers, Janette: "I used to volunteer for SRSB a few years ago as a Befriender then I helped out at fundraising events both of which I really enjoyed. I like to volunteer in person, so after the restrictions during Covid I got in touch to find out about My Guide. I was matched with one of **SRSB's** clients who just wanted to visit the shops and have someone with her to help build her confidence. We hit it off straight away and have been having a great time together. It is very rewarding to help someone else."

A Tribute to Margaret: We were very sorry to hear that one of our volunteers, Margaret, had passed away earlier this year and we want to express our deepest condolences to her friends and family. She was one of SRSB's longstanding volunteers. Amongst other roles, she worked with our Craft Group for many years, hardly ever missing a session. More recently she took on the role of a Tele-Friend keeping in touch with a group of clients who may be at risk of becoming socially isolated. Over the past 30 years she has made a huge difference to many people with sight loss in Sheffield, and all in her own modest way. She will be missed, and her support and kindness has meant a lot to many people. Thank you Margaret.

Fundraising

Steve updates us: A huge thank you to everyone who has already supported us in 2023. It's been great to see things get back a bit closer to 'normal' this year after the pandemic.

We've had some great support from Trusts and in the community since the last newsletter. The West Riding Masonic Charities provided a grant of £34,500 to purchase the new lift at **RSS** and we received a further £10,000 towards the appeal from the Bernard Sunley Foundation. Barnsley Morris Minor Owners Club nominated **SRSB** for support from their annual car show at Graves Park and Sheffield Freemasons chose us to benefit from their annual walk around Dam Flask Reservoir on 21st May. Over 40 people attended our first **SRSB** pub quiz of the year in March. The next quiz is scheduled for June. In July, a Robbie

Williams tribute will 'entertain you', Sheffield Lego Users Group host an event at Mappin Street in August, our Annual Golf Day takes place in September, as does our Indian Summer Soul event at Mappin Street.
